Our **Parish Survey** results have been tabulated. There were many good suggestions which Parish Council is working with now. One clear direction was the desire to return to **coffee fellowship** after the worship. The Water of Life Project was formed in September 2003. Its mission: to create a "caring community working together to raise funds to drill wells giving life and hope to African communities."

In the 19 years since then, we have been involved in several projects — we have raised sufficient funds to dig wells, repaired many broken pumps and supported health clinics for villages receiving a well. Over 46,000 people now have access to safe drinking water because of our efforts since 2003.
