Each week, we invite you to take home a Christmas ornament and reflect on the meaning of the name featured on the ornament. Bring it back with you the next Sunday, if you wish, and take a different ornament home with you. Over the season, you will learn about several of the sacred names of Jesus and make one ornament yours to keep.

We will also be gifting each household with an inter-generational Advent calendar called "Slow Down. Quiet. It's Advent" for use throughout the season. It is filled with creative ideas and reflections, questions, prayers and activities to help you make time to grow your spirit and draw closer to God as you prepare for Christmas.

Peace Service: Join us on Sunday, December 10th at 7:00 p.m. for a service of quiet prayer, reflection and music as we pray for peace in Israel and Palestine, Ukraine and Russia, and around the world.


