Lent Series: Our Lenten series this year is called "Ask." From the intro: A lot of times, when people encounter a big question in their life of faith, it can feel isolating. Forbidden, even. Do-not-go-there territory. But what if faith requires us to ask questions? What if we need questions to survive and grow as a community of faith? You want to go there, don't you? You want to believe dialogue with God, relationship with God, requires questions. Well, guess what? You're in good company. "Ask" is a Lenten series for anyone who's ever had a question about their faith. There are three ways to be involved in "Ask."

(Remember that some questions aren't meant to have answers!) Rev Lori will also spend ½ hour each Sunday after the worship for an informal time to talk about the questions raised for us during the week.
