Today is the conclusion of our **Water of Life Project for 2023**! In the weeks to come, you will hear more about this well-creating and water improving program. Again this year, we partner with Lifewater Canada, social community groups, schools and individuals around Colchester County as they help us to dig wells in Africa and Haiti.

We're very proud of this St. John's created and led initiative in our community. We encourage you to support this important, life saving and life changing project and also to inform and encourage your friends, family and co-workers to get involved.

The Water of Life Project was formed in September 2003. Its mission: to create a "caring community working together to raise funds to drill wells giving life and hope to African communities."

In the 19 years since then, we have been involved in several projects — we have raised sufficient funds to dig wells, repaired many broken pumps and supported health clinics for villages receiving a well. Over 46,000 people now have access to safe drinking water because of our efforts since 2003.

**Terrace Hill Cemetery** reopened on May 1<sup>st</sup>. Truro Cemetery Corporation opened later in May than usual, therefore our clean up will be delayed by several weeks.

Our **Parish Survey** results have been tabulated. There were many good suggestions which Parish Council is working with now. One clear direction was the desire to return to **coffee fellowship** after the worship. We will begin having coffee hour on a trial basis in May and June to gauge availability and interest of volunteers. Watch for a survey synopsis soon and for other initiatives related to the results in the fall.

**Pride Parade:** This year's Pride Parade takes place on Saturday, June 24<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 p.m. Again, St. John's will send a walking group to the event. If you would like to be part of our team, speak to Rev. Lori or Melinda Tattrie. (Watch for an appearance of our special guest walker, The Paraclete!)

Offerings Update: As of the end of April, our total year to date offerings received were \$43,702. This means that we are behind \$2,677 from where we need at this point in the year to be in order to meet our 2023 budget. Going forward, we will be posting the previous Sunday's offerings in each week's bulletin. At the end of each month, we will update our performance against the budget (seasonally adjusted) to allow our congregation to have a clearer picture of our financial realities. May 7 offerings for the parish totaled \$1,429.
