**Common Cup:** Parish Council has decided to embark on an experimental return to the use of the common cup at the Eucharist. Our Bishop granted permission to return to the practice in November of 2022. As a parish, we have proceeded with caution on this as on all fronts with relation to Covid. In re-introducing the common cup, we will still have one chalice using the eye dropper to drop wine on the wafer and a second chalice as a common cup from which parishioners can drink. You are invited to make the choice that is best for you and cross to the appropriate chalice after receiving the host. **Note:** Dipping of the wafer (intinction) is not permitted in the common cup. We will begin offering both cups on June 4<sup>th</sup>. Parish Council will reassess at its meeting in late June. Masks continue to be available at the doors for those who wish them and we will continue with the practice of exchanging a hands free gesture of peace.

**Offerings Update:** End of April year to date offerings received were \$43,702 putting us behind \$2,677 from where we needed to be in order to meet our 2023 budget. **May 21** offerings for the parish totaled \$500.
